*Williams To Make A Special Announcement Regarding

COMPTON, CA — On Wednesday, July 8th, Compton Mayor Aja Brown will join U.S. Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Economic Development Jay Williams as he makes an important announcement regarding new ways the Department of Commerce's Economic Development Administration is supporting innovative manufacturing in Southern California. Assistant Secretary Williams will also offer an important update on the [Investing in Manufacturing Communities Partnership \(IMCP\) initiative](#), which is a Department of Commerce-led, Administration-wide initiative that focuses on accelerating the resurgence of manufacturing and creating well-paying jobs in regions across the nation.
